








Confidence to Work With an Employer






After the event 71% of pupils rated their Confidence to work with an employer as either Very Good or Excellent.





Your Communication Skills






After the event 86% of pupils rated their Communication Skills as either Good, Very Good or Excellent.






Working in Teams








After the event 100% of pupils rated their ability to Work in a Team as either Good, Very Good or Excellent.





Following Instructions





After the event 58% of pupils rated their ability to Follow Instructions as either Very Good or Excellent.





Problem Solving






After the event 100% of pupils rated their ability to Problem Solve as either Good or Very Good





Taking on Work Based Challenges





After the event 100% of pupils rated their ability to Take on Work Based Challenges as either Good, Very Good or Excellent.
