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EVENT SUMMARY

This was the second Careers Fair run in partnership between Hope View School and EBP Kent. The Careers Fair welcomed 7 stands, totalling the attendance of 11 employees. Pre-work with the school's SLT identified key areas that would meet student aspirations.

The Careers Fair took place from 0930 until 1430, with each year group throughout the school afforded allocated slots within the fair. The work done within the school to prepare the students was vital towards ensuring the students interacted well with the visiting organisations. The organisations were certainly impressed by the level of interaction.








